Application area

Application

Use a broad brush, a swab or the like. Scrub with a stiff brush afterwards, in order to remove green growth.

After care

Tools

Medium hard nylon brush, plastic bucket, and a garden hose for the rinsing.

Machine application using a polishing machine is also possible. A detailed instruction is available on the internet.

Clean tools with water and soap.

Exterior Cleaner is for the cleaning of wood decking, garden furniture, cladding/sidings, fences, doors, carports etc. The product removes green growth and dirt. Exterior Cleaner is also very suitable for the cleaning of brickwork and concrete plates.

- 1 Soak the wood with plenty of water. If possible use a garden hose.
- 2 Mix Exterior Cleaner with water in the ratio 1:2 and apply it with stiff brush. By extreme dirt, the Exterior Cleaner may be used undiluted.
- 3 Scrub the soaked wood lengthwise the wood grain till the wood appears clean. Repeat the cleaning if necessary.
- 4 Immediately after cleaning, hose down the surface with water.

5 Clean tools in water.

6 Leave the wood to dry for approx. 24 hours. The wood must be completely dry before an oil treatment. Remove fibre rising with sandpaper.
